

## 3. Details of the session:

Community members started to arrive to attend the meeting at 10:00 AM. BOT Selection and Election Committee Started distribution and collection of the Nomination Form at the Dining Hall.

By 10:40 AM Secretary Dilli (Siddhartha) Silwal called to order the meeting and requested the Chairperson of Executive committee of Board of Trustees Bhakta Thapa to Chair the Annual General Meeting. Upon acknowledgement by the Chairperson, Secretary Silwal moved forward with the meeting. For the official Opening Ceremony, secretary Silwal requested Temple Priest Acharya Choodamani Pathak to do Mangala Charan and President Bhandari, Chairperson Thapa, Platinum Patron Veda Bhakta

Joshi, Platinum Patron Akaraj pandey, Patron and Honorary Consul of Nepal Rishi Dhakal to do Deep Prajwalan.

After the Opening Ceremony, Secretary Silwal formally started the meeting by recognizing Past Presidents, Patrons, advisors, Trustees, Board of Directors, Members of the Executive Committee of Board of Trustees, Life Members, General Members, Community Members, and Representatives of other Nepali organizations present at the Meeting.

Moving further, Secretary Silwal presented some historical facts of the Foundation below.

#### **Annual General Meeting 12/10/2023**

#### 1. Facts about The Shree Pashupatinath Foundation, USA

- a. The First pledge received for the foundation \$ 53014 from Akaraj Pandey, Manita Basnet, Netra Mainali, Deepak Pathak, Prem Guragain, Bhakta Thapa, Punnakhar Dhakal "Rishi", Madan Pathak, Mukunda Dhungana, Basudev Ghimire, Rajendra Siwakoti, Shiva Adhikari, Dil B Shrestha, Gokul Poudyal, and \$500 cash donation was received from the cultural performance by Nepali artist Om Bikram Bist.
- b. February 03, 2010, The Foundation was incorporated as Shree Pashupatinath foundation, USA and received tax exempt status on May 10, 2010.
- c. The Satsang movement inspired by Dr. Chintamani Nath Yogi and Shrimad Bhagwat Mahapuran orated by Bachan Praveen Deen Bandhu Pokhrel on July 04-11, 2011, was a major milestone to raise funds of the foundation.
- d. November 16, 2012, Temple property was purchased at \$1,050,000 with down payment and closing cost of \$559, 416.63 and rest in loan guaranteed by Bhakta Thapa, Ram Lama, Rishi Dhakal and Akaraj Pandey.
- e. The foundation received a Conditional Use Permit on April 9, 2014, and major construction of the temple was complete at the end of 2017.
- f. A Grand Pran Pratistha Ceremony was held February 11, 12, 13, 2018 and Grand opening ceremony was held on March3, 2019.



- g. Bhakta Thapa was a longest serving President who served two terms 2009-14 and 2014-2014 totaling of 9 years and longest serving secretary Rameshor Bhandari 2014-18, and 2021-22 for total of 6 years.
- h. A total of 1,432 donors have contributed amounts ranging from just 1 penny to as much as \$286,000.
- i. July 31, 2019, Mortgage loan was paid off.
- j. Shree Pashupatinath Foundation runs active Nepali Pathshala for kids and Sanskrit Pathshala for adults.

#### 2. Current Membership Status of the Foundation (Total 1432)

- a. Currently the numbers of Board of Trustees are 86 (which includes 2 Platinum Patron, 9 Patrons and 75 Trustees)
- b. Currently Numbers of life Members are 240 (which includes 2 Platinum Patron, 9 Patrons, 75 Trustees and 154 life members)
- c. Currently There are 1192 General Members and Temple citizen Members combined.

### **Welcome and Report of the President:**

President Rameshor Bhandari welcomed the attendees and presented the activity report and future planning as below.

Respected Members of the General Assembly,

Namaste and welcome to the 2024 Annual General Meeting! I would like to extend my profound gratitude to my fellow board colleagues for their outstanding teamwork and dedication throughout my two-year term as the president of our prestigious Foundation. I hope this spirit of collaboration will continue in the years to come.

I am deeply grateful to our advisors, Board of Trustees, life members, donors, and members of the Nepali diaspora for your unwavering support. It is truly a privilege to serve as the President of this esteemed Foundation and to lead it to the next level. This AGM presents an opportunity for us to reflect on the past year's activities and

the successes we have achieved. I will take a few minutes to highlight some of our key accomplishments and share my suggestions for the future.

This year, we focused our efforts on collecting the donations pledged by our community members during Los Angeles Spiritual Festival and Shiva Mahapuran in July 2023. This event proved to be a turning point, not only strengthening our financial position but also attracting new and emerging donors to our Foundation's network.

Our commitment to building a community center remains unwavering, and we understand that achieving this vision requires robust financial support. As many of you know, our team has been diligently working to generate revenue.

This year, we successfully raised approximately \$500,000, and our current bank balance exceeds \$1.2 million. Our team has remained focused on collecting pledged donations and working towards securing the property for the proposed Nepalese Cultural Center (NCC).

This year, we reached out to all our donors at least three to four times, requesting them to fulfill their pledged contributions. As the team leader, I personally contacted most of the donors to express our gratitude for their pledges and ongoing support on behalf of the Foundation. Additionally, we hired a part-time staff member to contact donors. We have made a significant progress in strengthening the Foundation, which now consists of three wings: Shree Pashupatinath and Buddha Mandir, Nepalese Cultural Center, and Nepali Pathashala. Their DBA names have been officially registered with the County of Los Angeles. Our temple is running smoothly, and the Nepali Pathashala is experiencing a significant growth. Currently, **around 90 students** are enrolled in the Nepali language class. In addition, we introduced Sanskrit class last year, which now has **12 students**, some of whom participate online. I am happy to share that all these programs are self-sustaining.

Dear members, the NCC project we launched last year may seem ambitious, but it is essential to meet the growing needs of our community. Our current temple is unable to accommodate devotees during special events, which underscores the necessity of this project. Although we have been actively searching for a suitable property for the NCC, we have yet to find one that meets our needs. The available properties either exceed our budget or are not suitable for our vision. As a result, we have focused our efforts on collecting pledged contributions, and I am pleased to report that we are in a strong financial position. To continue advancing the NCC project, it is crucial that we maintain our efforts in securing these pledged donations.

We have collected a substantial amount in the past one-and-a-half years. You would agree that securing nearly 40 percent of pledged donations is exemplary for a nonprofit organization like ours. This success would not have been possible without the collective efforts of our community members. I want to express my deepest gratitude to all of you for your generous donations, support, and hard work in making last year's grand fundraising project a reality. I look forward to your continued involvement as we move forward.

Together, we have accomplished a great deal, but there is still much more to be done. Now, I would like to take a moment to highlight some of our most significant achievements.

Thank you once again for your ongoing support. Here are the major events organized at the temple.

## **2024 HIGHLIGHTS:**

- Attraction of new and emerging donors: Our organization has seen a significant growth in membership and new donors since we conducted the Los Angeles Spiritual Festival and Shiva Mahapuran in July 2023. This event has already proven to be a milestone in laying the groundwork for the Nepalese Cultural Center (NCC) we have envisioned, having raised approximately \$850,000 of the \$2.2 million in pledges.
- Our organization now has 321 Life Members and 115 Board of Trustee Members.
- Continuation of Nepali Calendar: We started publishing Nepali Calendar since this board assumed office.
- **Installation of security apparatus:** We secured our temple with a taller fence and installed additional security cameras and motion detecting lights.
- Sanskrit class an addition to Nepali Pathasala: We expanded our Nepali Pathasala by adding Sanskrit class in September 2023. Our Nepali and Sanskrit language programs are fully self-sustaining.
- **Sunday Prasad:** We managed to offer prasad (food) every Sunday throughout the past two years.
- **Networking with local elected officials:** We have tried to obtain government support for our Foundation by meeting local elected officials at our temple and interacting with them. This year, we organized presentation meetings with Norwalk Mayor Ana Valencia and California State Assemblywoman (67<sup>th</sup> District) Sharon Quirk-Silva.

• **Application for State Grants:** We have applied for a security grant from the State of California.

#### **Suggestions for the future:**

I would like to offer the following suggestions to the new board of directors:

- 1. Purchase property for the Nepalese Cultural Center and collect at least one million pledged donations.
- 2. Reach out to new donors: Add patrons, trustees, and life members.
- 3. Increasing enrollment in automatic payment plan: We should reach out to all Trustees and life members to enroll them in the dollar-a-day program. Offer free birthday puja to the family members who enroll in the dollar-a-day-program. This board decided this on March 26, 2023.
- 4. There is an ongoing controversy regarding the calendar of festivals observed by Nepali diaspora in various countries. Our temple is observing traditional Nepali calendar, and we took this decision at our last year's AGM. The controversy continues. We initiated conversations with other temple's executives and trustees, but this issue remains inconclusive. The new board should continue to work in this direction.
- 5. Some donors enrolled in the dollar-a-day program have expressed interest in deducting their pledged dues from their monthly contributions. Allowing donors to combine their contributions could help maximize monthly income and expedite pledge collections. I hope this AGM can take a decision in this regard.

It has been a pleasure working together with each one of you to make this foundation great.

Now I would like to present the monthly activities briefly as follows:

## **January**

• On January 01, 2024, we organized a Samuhik Rudrabhishek & Nava Graha Puja on Monday, January 01. Shree Ishwar Krishna Maharaj was the special guest, and he narrated Musical Katha Satsang. There was enthusiastic participation of community members and devotees.



- On January 25, we organized a community Satsang in the house of Hem and Radha Thakulla in Pomona.
- Every Sunday is a special day for Bhajans and Satsang at our temple.

## **February**

- On February 4, we organized an event titled "Yoga, Vedanta, and Satsang" with Acharya Lakshman Panthi
- On February 11, we organized a Saraswati Puja at our temple. Nepali Pathasala children learned about Saraswati and performed their talents.

#### March

The temple was open to the public all day, and there was a large gathering in the morning and evening shifts although it fell on a Friday. Puja ingredients were provided for free. A significant amount of donation was collected from Shivaratri event.
- On March 24, we organized Holi Celebration at our temple. This event was especially meant for Nepali Pathasala children although our community members participated enthusiastically. As always, food was served.

## **April**

- On April 13, we organized a special Satyanarayan Puja, Bhajan and Satsang to observe Nepali New Year 2081 Bikram Sambat. It was an excellent event which was sponsored by Veda Bhakta Joshi.
- On April 14, we participated in Nepal Day Parade in San Francisco
- On April 17, we organized a special event to mark Ram Nawami and Basanta Navaratra.
- On April 27, we organized a special Bhajan with Deepak Raman

## May

 On May 18, a remarkable meet and greet with Assemblywoman Sharon Quirk-Silva was held at our temple. As the President, I gave a presentation on the



growth and aspirations of the Nepalese Americans in Southern California. We also sought the state's financial support for the Foundation.

- This event was organized at the temple in the evening.

## August

- On August 19, Janai Purnima/Rakskya Bandhan was observed.
- We initiated and added the traditional ritual of this ceremony by performing Shrawani Mahasnan at Seal Beach California. Janai and Rakshya Bandhan were distributed as usual.
- On August 26, Shree Krishna Janmasthami celebrations with special Puja, Bhajan and Satsang was organized
- Praveen Ghimire and Roshani Dhungana sponsored the Prasad. It was a grand celebration.

## September

- September 1: Teej Daar
- September 6: Teej Puja --held in four shifts. All four shifts were packed. There was significant enthusiasm and involvement of community members from various regions, especially new donors.
- September 8: Rishi Panchami Puja
- We collected a significant amount of donations from daar sponsorship and puja.
- September 30: Special Bhajan with singer Narendra Pyasi was organized.

#### October

• On October 5, we participated in Artesia International Street Fair and Diversity Festival.



- On October 6. Children's Grand Talent Show event was organized for Nepali Pathasala children. Special appreciation certificates were given. Veda Bhakta Joshi and Nepali Pathasala parents contributed for the event.
- From October 3-16, we celebrated Dashain.
  - As usual, there was a significant presence of community members during the 10-day celebration
  - JAMARA was distributed for free, but we encouraged community members to donate
  - About \$7000 was collected from Prasad sponsorship and Jamara distribution.

#### **November**

- Deusi-Bhailo: October 30 and November 1
  - This year's Deusi-Bhailo was held in two locations. We managed this year's Deusi-Bhailo a little differently. We brought together 16 Nepalese women entrepreneurs together and performed Deusi at our temple on November 1. Thank you to all women entrepreneurs who hosted Deusi-Bhailo at our temple. We are equally grateful to Yadav and Resu Chimouriya for hosting Deusi-Bhailo at their home in Baldwin Park on October 30. We managed to collect over \$50,000 cash including pledges. We are also grateful to Singer Krishna Devkota and other local artists for their volunteer cultural performance.
- November 16: A Sound Meditation event was organized with the help of Deep Deoja and Archana Deoja from San Diego.
- November 24: Swojagaran Dhyan program was organized. Secretary Dilli Raj Silwal conducted the event. There was enthusiastic participation of community members from across various regions of Southern California.

#### **December**

• We organized a special donor appreciation program on Sunday, December 8, to recognize the contributions made to the Nepalese Cultural Center (NCC)

project. We awarded the donors with plaques. There was an enthusiastic participation of donors, and we raised over \$100,000 in the course of this event.

• On December 21, we held a special event to mark the 1<sup>st</sup> International Meditation Day. The event was organized in association of Friends of Osho Nirvana San Diego. Veda Bhakta Joshi sponsored the event.

#### **Public Speakers and Public Concerns:**

Secretary Silwal opened the floor for questions and concerns from the members.

1. Life member Dilli Prasad Thapaliya applauds the improved presentation of the President's report and annual financial report. He further added that members should know the financials in advance in comparison with previous years' financials, at least for 3 years, and it would be useful to find the trend of income and expenses. He further suggested that we should plan to self-sustain by investing the available funds, budget planning and upgrading the value of the property in redfin, Zillow and other real estate platforms.

Treasure Ghimire and President Bhandari answered Mr. Thapaliya that all available efforts and improvements will be made in coming years.

2. Trustee Er. Kanhaiya Kayastha proposed that recognizing donations made in memory of late loved ones on the donor wall and website could serve as a meaningful encouragement and similar decisions has been made in the past. He inquired whether donations made under pledged commitments or on specific occasions are being accurately recorded. He praised the foundation for its enhanced overall operations.

President Bhandari answered that most of the information has been recorded accurately categorically per request of the donor but for the donor's wall it's been challenging to put many details. Treasurer Ghimire added that there is still an old pledge due from Mahapuran of 2011.

- 3. Trustee Ramchandra Lamichhane put some suggestions on behalf of the community.
  - A. Give some space at the temple for the contribution of Bachan Pravin Din Bandhu Pokhrel.
  - B. Giving membership on pledged amount.
  - C. finding space for after death ritual (kriya putri bhawan) for those who has lack of spaces at their residences.
  - D. Encourage women to serve in Committees.
  - E. Hiring an office assistant.
  - F. Documents such as Bylaws must be also in Nepali

President Bhandari addressed the concerns raised, expressing gratitude to all individuals who supported and contributed to the construction of the temple. He acknowledged the challenge of finding adequate space for death rituals due to limited availability and restrictions on existing areas, such as garages. He emphasized the need for a significantly larger space to meet the community's requirements.

Regarding the prudent use of funds, he stated that hiring an office assistant must be carefully considered. He also remarked that granting memberships based on pledged donations is not a practical approach.

On the matter of bylaws in Nepali, he recommended adhering to the law of the land, noting that translation is not a significant issue due to the availability of free translation software. Additionally, he encouraged and welcomed women to participate actively in committees.

At the end of questions and concerns, Secretary Silwal suggested that participation is the key to forward and achieving the goal of the foundation. We should add more programs to benefit the community members and be open to collaborating with other organizations if necessary.
